Also, with a namesake that is reminiscent of a rolling wave in the ocean, the Monterey Copper Bowl is a larger copper piece at 8"D X 2 1/4" H. The bowl's curved-shaped lip is like the arc of a gentle wave becoming an artistic focal piece on a dining room table or to hold snacks at a party. The bowl is available in Antique or Tempered finishes.

Another highlight includes the Los Olivos Copper Pitcher, which features an elegant curve, emulating the simple beauty of a flower bending in the wind or a wave poised to crash on the beach. This striking pitcher can be filled with colorful flowers or kitchen utensils or even take center stage perched on an end table.

About National CASA for Children (www.casaforchildren.org): Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) for Children is a network of 946 community-based programs that recruit, train and support citizen-volunteers to advocate for the best interests of abused and neglected children in courtrooms and communities. The only program of its kind, CASA volunteers are empowered by the courts to provide children with one-on-one advocacy. CASA volunteers see their assigned children regularly and interview all the adults who impact their lives. Volunteer advocates offer judges the critical information they need to ensure each child's rights and needs are being attended to while in foster care, staying with the child until she is placed in a loving permanent home. For many abused children, their CASA volunteer is the only constant adult presence in their lives.
